Lighting of the Advent Candle

Second Sunday – Hope for Those Who Are Weary

Responsive Litany:

- L: The Light shines in the darkness,
- C: but the darkness has not overcome it.
- L: During Advent our weary souls seek God's daily strength
- C: The Lord gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak.
- L: We grow weary when fear overshadows faith.
- C: The Lord gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak.

First Lesson: Malachi 3:1-4

¹See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight—indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. ²But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears?

For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; ³he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. ⁴Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years.

Second Lesson: Philippians 1:3-11



Luke 3:1-6



NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almiahty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven; by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. 

LORD'S PRAYER


Lord, remember us in your kingdom, and teach us to pray:
